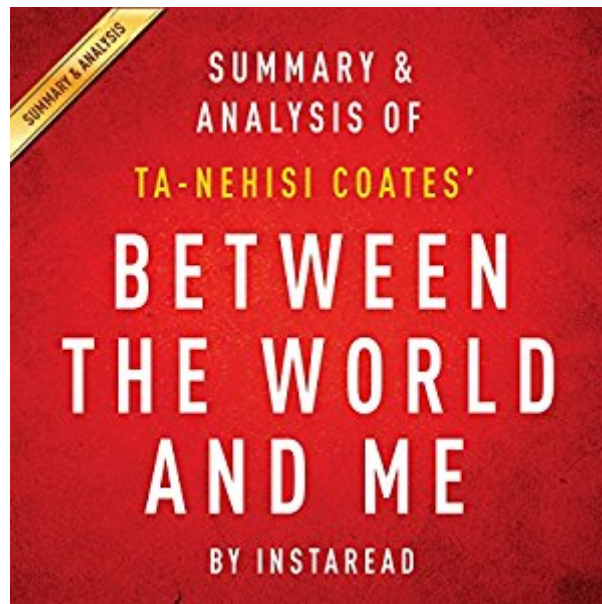

"*Between the World and Me*" is a powerful book, and none of the impact is lost in this summary version. It has been a while since the last time I had read something so profound, and on such a sensitive topic as 9/11. I wanted to know as much about the story and characters as I could, so I bought this summary, and luckily it is not that long. Even though it is short, it covers and analyzes all

the major points. If you've read the original book, you've probably found some conflict with many of the author's statements, but the summary helps to clear this up. You can really view the book in an unbiased light. I highly recommend this summary as a companion and insight guide to the original book.

I came to this summary to help resolve my conflicts about the actual book, particularly Coates's statements about the New York City firefighters that died on 9/11. *BETWEEN THE WORLD AND ME* is a powerful book, but it is sometimes hard to distinguish Coates's meanings versus his internal conflict that he's trying to resolve on paper. Thankfully, Instaread helps pick out the main themes and pull them together, especially helpful considering the back-and-forth nature of the book. This summary isn't the longest I've seen from Instaread, but neither is the actual book (it's a short book). However, all the essentials are here: the summary, the character reviews, the major themes, and the analysis of the writer's style. Readers will especially appreciate the definitions of Coates's created words, such as "The Dreamers" and "The Mecca". And yes, this summary helped resolve some of my conflict about Coates's statements about the firefighters, telling me that he was so impacted by Prince Jones's death that he couldn't fully see or celebrate them as heroes. While this book was created around the idea of Michael Brown, Prince Jones takes a more major stage: as this summary points out, explaining how it all plays into the overall book's concepts. There are many things that sadden me about Coates's book, and some things I don't agree with: Instaread does a fine job of taking the main points without getting into personal feelings or opinions. If you are looking for a summary that offers a non-biased approach, this is perfect.

The original book is a letter by Ta-Nehesi Coates to his son, Samori. He starts in Philadelphia where he was raised in the inner city as a child of a black family. What does it mean to be a child and parent in the black community? What are the social, cultural and legal realities? (Important to note here that this book is based on Ta-Nehesi's experience in America and is written for/to Americans although folks from other places may well enjoy it.) This DETAILED review by Instaread starts off with a 10 page (Kindle) summary providing the reader with a good synopsis of the book. It then delves into some of the main characters and analysis. Who are "The Dreamers"? Why does Ta-Nehesi conclude, among other things that the black community is "at the mercy of these Dreamers"? Instaread describes the text as being "like a sharp slap in the face..." Some of the other themes discussed are: >>> Racism >>> The dynamic between children and parents in the African American community >>> Finding freedom as a black man in America >>> Black women and their

fate within societyThe original book is written in the second person. The summary misstates even basic facts in the book (Coates was not raised in Philly, as noted in summary, as several other misstated facts in the summary). This summary may very well confuse more than clarify because it misses vital points made clear in the beautiful prose of the actual book. Just buy the book. There's nothing to summarize, it must be read, the concept is too heavy to summarize.
